TITLE IX SEX DISCRIMINATION	Title IX sex discrimination related to university employees, university students, university applicants, persons/groups participating in or accessing university-sponsored programs/activities/facilities, & vendors/contractors in their relationship with the university Title IX sex discrimination encompasses sex-based harassment, which includes sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, & stalking	Anyone can report, but the following must report: Employees or agents of the university who: supervise other employees, graduate or undergraduate students, contractors, or agents; teach or advise students or groups; or have management authority related to a university-sponsored program or activity The following Title IX Confidential Employees are exempt from reporting responsibilities: Campus Health medical providers, Counseling & Psych Services professional counselors, Ombuds Committee members, Survivor Advocates, & researchers (while conducting an Institutional Review Board-approved human-subjects research study designed to gather information about sex discrimination) Title IX Confidential Employees must inform impacted individuals/victims of their confidential employee status & lack of reporting responsibility as well as provide the individual with specific information.
